We're Accelerating Home **Building in Mississippi Mills**

The housing crisis is very real in Mississippi Mills. Families applications. The funds will cannot find homes that they can afford, and the financial pressures the Municipality is experiencing from growth are enormous. This is why we are accelerating the home building process with help from the Canada Mortgage Housing Corporation's (CMHC) Housing Accelerator Fund (HAF).

The first installation of the \$3.3 million awarded to Mississippi Mills will be used for 2025 capital projects that support growth and efficient service delivery, including a new www.mississippimills.ca/HAF e-permitting software for issuing





New Childcare Centre Project

Council is exploring building a new Mississippi Mills Childcare Services facility at 34 Victoria St. in Almonte. The proposed project would replace the current childcare centre on State Street.

The current facility houses 73 childcare spaces. With Canada wide Early Learning and Childcare (CWELCC) funding, administered by Lanark County, the expansion would allow for an additional 78 spaces. That would bring the total licensed capacity to 151 CWELCC spaces, along with additional room for future growth.


Study Before Getting Muddy

Thinking of finally building that deck? Review the Municipality's Spring Building Spotlight before you commit to any project.

The building department has created this easy-to-understand guide to help residents follow zoning regulations when building projects such as decks, porches, sheds, garages, pools, hot tubs, enclosures, fences, and drainage systems. Different residential zones have different set-back distances and height limitations. For example, the maximum height of a garage in R1 zoning is 4.5 metres, whereas it is 12 metres in RU zoning.

Residents can confirm the zoning of their property by entering its address into the online mapping tool found on the municipal website.

Ashes Take Longer to Cool Than You May Think

Early last spring, the Mississippi Mills Fire Department (MMFD) responded to six grass • Do not discard your ashes and structure fires, five of which ignited from discarded ashes: That's five dangerous fires that could've likely been prevented if the ashes had been disposed of properly.

Coals and ashes from fires can remain hot enough to reignite and start a fire many days after the fire was put out. The exact amount of time for complete extinguishment and cooling depends on many factors such as how hot the fire was, what was burning, how much unburned fuel remains, etc.

Always call the burn permit line (613-706-4004) to activate your burn permit before lighting the fire and exercise caution when disposing of ashes.

Here are some tips on how to dispose of ashes safely:

- into any combustible container such as a paper or plastic bag, a cardboard box, or a plastic trash can. Instead, use a metal, non-combustible container with a lid.
- Do not place the ash container on decks. porches or in garages. Instead, keep the container OUTSIDE the home, away from your fireplace or stove and anything combustible.
- Pour water into the container to make sure the ashes are cool.
- Teach all family members and quests how to be safe around fires, including fireplaces and wood stoves.



Fire Season Has Begun

Under Open Air Fire By-law 17-35. holders of valid fire permits may not burn brush, drum, and windrow fires between the hours of 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. from April 1 to October 31, 2025. This type of burning is limited to the evening during this time of the year because temperatures traditionally get a little cooler and humidity rises at night. Vegetation soaks up some of that moisture, making it a less volatile fuel for wildfires.

Please check our website or call 613-706-4004 before burning to ensure there is no burn ban in place. Permits may be obtained free of charge online at mm.burnpermits.com.

Read the by-law carefully to ensure that you understand specific restrictions to open air burning before you burn.


