Despite what your navigation app told you on your way here, it's pronounced "Almonte," with a silent "e."

Amonte

This picturesque town came to be what it is today after an initial boom in the textile industry that lasted until the 1950s.

Today, as you stroll the downtown core, you'll notice the remnants of the textile industry; multiple stone structure mills converted to other uses such as restaurants and galleries, as well as a railway converted into a trail.

The town has since pivoted to becoming the centrepoint for art in the Ottawa Valley. There are a variety of unique galleries, hand-made goods stores, potteries, antique markets, painters guilds, theatre groups, and so much more.

DOWNTOWN ALMONTE

Situated to the south-east of Almonte, Appleton is a quaint collection of homes that ideally look out towards the sparkling Mississippi River. Enjoy a picnic at the Appleton Village Park, or gather your family at the Old Mill Manor for a stay by the rapids.

Appleto

The hidden gem of Mississippi Mills! Once home to a sawmill, gristmill and a timber slide, today the Blakeney Rapids are top-oflist for those looking to explore the Mississippi River. To the west of Almonte, you'll find Clayton, the home to the beautiful Clayton Lake and the Indian River. The charming village is a popular spot for fishing, boating, and hiking, while the bountiful hardwood forests make it a maple syrup centre for the region.

Ramsay Ward is a mix of farming lowlands along the Mississippi River and the more rugged borders of the Canadian Shield. Historically, the Mississippi and Indian Rivers played an important role in the development of the former Township of Ramsay.

Summer invites outdoor enthusiasts to hike the serene paths of the **High Lonesome Nature Reserve** or tee off at **Pakenham Highlands Golf Club**, where lush fairways meet breathtaking views. As autumn paints the countryside in brilliant hues, these activities take on an added charm, ensuring every season in Pakenham is a celebration of nature and adventure!



Step Back into the 1840s The 1840s General Store and

Bakery has been serving the area for many decades. Originally built in 1840, the store still maintains its charm with wood floors, original wooden counters and antiques used by the first owners. GLAM is the acronym for cultural institutions such as Galleries, Libraries, Archives, and Museums – of which Mississippi Mills has many to offer!

Embrace local heritage at the North Lanark Regional Museum, discover why Mississippi Mills was once known as the "Manchester of the North" at the Mississippi Valley Textile Museum, and take a walk through the lives of Dr. R. Tait McKenzie (sculptor, surgeon, and pioneer in preventive and rehabilitative medicine), Ethel McKenzie (poet), and Dr. James Naismith (inventor of basketball) at the historic Mill of Kintail Museum.

Who said visiting out-of-town had to be expensive? On top of our museums that are generally pay-by-donation, there is lots more to see out in the open here in Mississippi Mills.

The Seven Gifts

This installation pays tribute to the Seven Grandfather Teachings of the Algonquin Anishinaabe Peoples. Each stone supports a bronze totem animal representing one of the gifts. Intrepretive signage and a commemorative plaque, as well as native plantings with Indigenous significance, completes the sacred space of healing and reflection.



The Lanark County Interval House Pebble Mosaic

Start the Riverwalk trail with the Pebble Mosaic next to the Almonte Old Town Hall. This beautiful collection of intricately combined pebbles honour those affected by gender-based violence and imagines a world without violence. Be sure to check out its sister installations in Carleton Place and Smiths Falls, as well.

Greet the Murals of Mill Street

You don't have to walk far to come face-to-face with a historical figure on Mill Street. In fact, the entire street is covered in murals, high and low! Take a stroll while you shop and see who you can spot - you might learn a new thing or two about them.



Do You Ever Wonder?

Take a glimpse back at your childhood with the sculpture of Gloria Gopher from Under the Umbrella Tree, a CBC favourite TV show from the 1980s. Placed on the Ottawa Valley Recreational Trail beside the Almonte Library, this sculpture honours the show's creator, puppeteer Noreen Young, who calls Almonte home.



The Inventor of Basketball

In the heart of Almonte sits the beloved statue of James Naismith. Take a seat next to him and snap some selfies; you won't find anyone as photogenic as he is.

A visit to Mississippi Mills wouldn't be complete without exploring one (or more) of the rivers and lakes that make this community so unique. Situated along the shores of the Mississippi and Indian Rivers, and amidst three lakes — the Mississippi, Clayton, and White — a water-based focus has been woven into the fabric of our community.

Picnic on the Beach

Mississippi Mills features two unsupervised beaches — the **Almonte Beach** on Water Street and the **Pakenham Beach** on Margaret Street. Both beaches conveniently provide changerooms and lots of space to spread out a blanket to fully enjoy a beach day with your family.

Be Glad for the Splash Pad Fun for kids of all ages, the **Splash Pad at Gemmill Park** makes a great alternative if the beaches are too busy or closed. The dumping buckets is a fan-favourite!

Go out for a Paddle

Launch your canoe or kayak and experience the beautiful plants and wildlife nature has to offer on our waterways. Boat launches are available at **Almonte Beach, Almonte Old Town Hall, Metcalfe Geoheritage Park, Appleton Bay Park, Clayton Taylor Park, Pakenham Five-Span Bridge Park**, and on Blakeney Road just before the rapids.

Recreational Trail, a former rail corridor. Spot rare seasonal birds and other wildlife at the trails of the Mill of Kintail Conservation Area. Take in the full beauty of the Mississippi River with the Almonte Riverwalk, spanning multiple bridges,

falls and dams. Reflect on the sacrifices of our veterans as you stroll down **Veteran's Memorial Walkway**.

Navigate your way through pine trees to reach the lake on **Kate's Lake Trail**.

The **Almonte Wellness Trail** is an interactive, educational and multi-generational initiative providing outdoor space for the community with a wide range of activities.

There's no better way of getting to know a place than walking it. Time travel to the founding days of our villages by picking up a copy of our self-guided walking tours at Almonte Old Town Hall. We have one for each village, plus the trails of Almonte.

Pakenham

The first settlers came to this area in 1823, to clear land and build shanties, potash works and mills. This set the stage, circa 1840, for the establishment of the village of Pakenham. This tour takes you back, providing a glimpse of its history.





Downtown Almonte

This short walk of the historic downtown area will show you parts of the Almonte that was. Cast your mind back to the mid to late 19th century when the town—dubbed the "Manchester of Canada" had quickly developed into a thriving centre of Canada's textile industry.



Trails of Almonte

This walk combines Almonte's Riverwalk with a portion of the Ottawa Valley Recreational Trail (OVRT) to make a loose circuit. Discover Almonte's history in the many interpretive panels that line the way—including its roots in the textile industry —and follow in the footsteps of the textile workers themselves along the Millworkers' Walk.



Blakeney

Known previously as Norway Pine Falls, Snedden's Mills, and Rosebank, the village was named Blakeney in 1874. Walkabout and see why this "bay" area on the Mississippi River was quickly recognized as a centre for potential.

Clayton

The first settlers came to this area in the early 1820s. The village of Clayton grew around a grist mill and a saw mill. Later there were stores, hotels, blacksmiths, cobblers, a carding mill, a tannery, a cheese factory, and several other businesses. Take this tour and you'll notice the remnants of a once bustling village.

Appleton

The first settlers came to Appleton in the 1820s and harnessed the natural falls of the Mississippi River to build a community. A sawmill and grist mill were built in 1824 and a blacksmith, a cobbler, a general store, a woollen mill and other businesses soon followed. This tour provides a glimpse of Appleton's history.

Par-tee with Your Friends

With a challenging landscape that varies from picturesque, rolling meadows to rocky outcrops, Mississippi Mills is a golfer's paradise. Choose between three excellent courses that will each challenge your skills on the links.

In Ramsay, you'll find **The Scottish Glen** golf course, a nine-hole public course situated in scenic, rolling parkland, leading golfers through naturally wooded areas and green, open spaces.

In Appleton, you're invited to explore a hidden gem of a course, the **Mississippi Golf Club**, tucked away beside the sparkling Mississippi River. Experience this immaculately groomed 18hole semi-private golf club that gladly welcomes green fee players and tournaments.

In historic Pakenham, the **Pakenham Highlands Golf Club** features a 27-hole championship course, with three definitive 9-hole courses: Lake Course, Canyon Course and Island Course. Check each club's website for information about tournaments, special events and golf-and-stay packages to combine your experience into a weekend or multi-day event.

Basket Some Discs

Join the growing trend; try out disc golf today! **Gemmill Park** in Almonte is home to an 18-hole (basket) disc golf course that provides a variety of challenges in its wooded areas, open fields, elevated grounds, and overall course layout. Residents can borrow frisbee discs from the library, and the **Almonte Disc Golf Club** hosts events and meetups for locals and visitors throughout the year.

Learn About Rocks

Discover 2.5 billion years of geological history at the **Metcalfe Geoheritage Park**. The park is Canada's first

geoheritage park, and is situated beside the Mississippi River on Almonte Street. More than 20 samples of sedimentary rocks of Ordovician age from the Almonte area (490 to 440 million years old), along with older igneous and metamorphic rocks of Precambrian age (2.5 billion to 1 billion years old), can be seen in the park. Take a stroll through the park and appreciate the many types of rocks that make up the regional topography.
