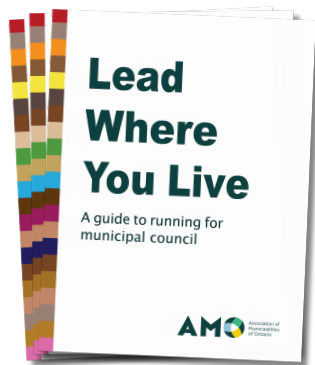

Thinking of Running for Municipal Council? Here is What to Know:

Contrary to common belief, one does not need municipal experience to run for municipal council! Elected officials provide strategic direction and oversight, while the day-to-day work of municipal governments is provided by municipal employees. So, if you think you know how to lead your community, there is a slot on the ballot waiting for your name.

There are many resources available to assist a diversity of candidates to apply, such as Association of Municipalities of Ontario (AMO)'s information sessions and/or workshops for youth, underrepresented candidates, urban Indigenous peoples, first-time candidates, and those seeking re-election. The best part: these resources are all free.

It is important to note that a single councillor cannot bring change forth for taxpayers, as decisions are made collectively. Councils benefit when people with different life experiences and skills come together to make a positive impact on their community. Strong democracies are made of diversity.

Ready to represent your community? To the right are some key dates and information you should know about:

May 1, 2026

This is the first day you can file a nomination. In Mississippi Mills, you will be required to file your nomination paper along with 25 endorsement signatures, as well as a filing fee of \$100 (if running for councillor) or \$200 (if running for mayor). You cannot begin campaigning until the municipal clerk accepts your paperwork as complete.

August 21, 2026

By 2 p.m., all candidates must file any remaining paperwork. This is also the last chance to withdraw your nomination. All final candidates will be certified by August 24.

September 1, 2026

Candidates gain access to the voters' list.

September 8, 2026

By-law compliant lawn signs are permitted.

October 26, 2026
Election Day

Your School Support Matters. Review it by June 1 to be Ready to Vote.



Did you know your school support designation determines which trustee election you can participate in for the next municipal and school board elections? In Ontario, property owners and tenants can choose which school board they support. Locally in Mississippi Mills, residents are served by the following school boards:

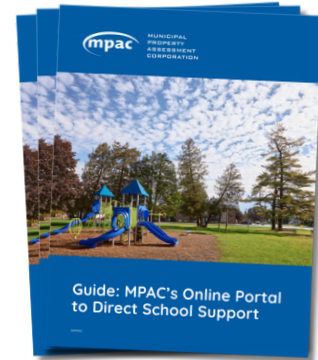
- Upper Canada District School Board (**UCDSB**)
- Catholic District School Board of Eastern Ontario (**CDSBEO**)
- Conseil Scolaire Catholique Du District Centre/Est (**CECCE**)
- Conseil des Écoles Publiques de l'Est de l'Ontario (**CEPEO**)

This designation also helps determine how you're listed

on the Preliminary List of Electors, placing you on the correct voters list for the municipal and school board elections.

MPAC (Municipal Property Assessment Corporation) is legislatively responsible for collecting school support designation data. This information is provided to Elections Ontario to help build and maintain the Preliminary List of Electors. School support designations should be reviewed and, if needed, updated by June 1, 2026, to be accurately included on the Preliminary List of Electors for the election on October 26, 2026.

Did You Know?

Running for *Mayor* or *Deputy Mayor* in Mississippi Mills also means running to represent the Municipality on the **Lanark County Council**.

Lanark County is an 'upper-tier' municipal government, containing eight 'lower-tier' municipalities (such as Mississippi Mills). The County Council is composed of two representatives from each lower-tier municipality (often the mayor/reeve and their deputy). Annually, members of the County Council elect a Warden to represent Lanark County. In addition to Municipal Council meetings, the County Council meets bi-weekly.

Flood Season is Here

The Mississippi Valley Conservation Authority (MVCA) released a flood outlook statement on March 30, 2026, highlighting the potential of flooding this spring due to rising temperatures, forecasted rain, and the melting snowpack. Now into April, the Municipality is continuing to actively monitor the water levels, working closely with its partners such as the MVCA to be prepared for potential flooding.

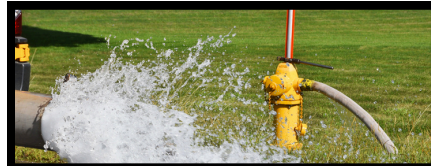
During significant flood events, the Municipality's primary role is to protect municipally-owned infrastructure, such as buildings, roads, and parks. To help residents protect their own property, we supply sand and sandbags at designated self-serve locations to be filled and brought home. Proper disposal of sandbags afterwards is the responsibility of the resident.

The MVCA also advises residents to take the necessary precautions to protect their own property by:

- Ensuring sump pumps are clear, working, and have a backwater valve.
- Having a portable generator and backup pump available.
- Ensuring downspouts are clear and the outlet is at least 3 metres from any structure.

This June 1 to 30, Get Active to Win! ParticipACTION Returns to Mississippi Mills

Riding the momentum of achieving a TOP 40 placement across Canada last year, Mississippi Mills is once again challenging their residents to get active this June. Every session at the gym or studio, group stretch at work, and school recess is a step towards Mississippi Mills being crowned Canada's Most Active Community in the ParticipACTION Community Challenge—but only if the organization you did your activity with reports the activity to ParticipACTION.

Reporting this activity is easy! Organizations can sign-up on the ParticipACTION website, create an activity file, then either daily, weekly, or even at the end of the month, report the estimated amount of participants in said activity. For example, a local gym can register and create an activity called "gym attendees," then at the end of the month, record that 6,000 people entered the gym to get active

over the 30 days (or 200 a day) based on how many people scanned their membership card. The same gym can also create an activity called "yoga classes" and report class attendance numbers in the same account.

Workplaces, schools, and community groups can register as an organization as well. If you start a walking group with your neighbours, that counts, too! The goal is to get people involved and active (and then report the numbers to make it count).

The Municipality will also be hosting free activities to encourage residents to get active. Last year, our 'yoga in the park' and solstice paddle down the Mississippi River were big hits.

Give Items a Second Life Through the Annual Exchange

Rounding out MM Spring Greening is the curbside **Annual Exchange Weekend**, running from May 1 to 3, 2026. Residents are invited to set out their unwanted, gently used items for others to discover and repurpose. Items may be set out starting Friday, May 1, and must be removed by Sunday, May 3, if not taken. Items should clearly be labeled as "FREE," and residents should take care to keep the curb clear of items they do not want taken.

**Flood Season: Be Prepared! Build an
Emergency Preparedness Kit**



May 3 to 9, 2026, marks **Emergency Preparedness Week**, and as we face conditions favourable for potentially hazardous floods this season, this is a good reminder to have emergency kits ready to go. This year's national theme is 'Be Prepared. Know Your Risks.' Floods may mean losing access to power or tap water—be prepared to be self-sufficient for at least 72 hours.

What should one pack in a 72-hour emergency kit? The Province of Ontario lists the following items as essential:

- **Food** (non-perishable and easy-to-prepare items, enough for three days) and a **manual can opener**
- Bottled or bagged **water** (4 litres per person for each day) and backup water purification tablets
- **Medication(s)**
- **Personal hygiene items** such as toilet paper, pads, soap, shampoo, tooth-brush, toothpaste, etc.
- **Personal protective equipment (PPE)** such gloves and masks
- **Cash** in small bills
- **Portable light sources** such as flashlights or headlamps
- **Radio** (crank or battery-run)
- Extra **batteries**, including back up chargers and power banks for phones
- **First-aid kit**
- **Candles** and **matches/lighter**
- **Hand sanitizer** or moist towelettes
- **Important papers** such as a copy of your emergency plan, identification, contact lists, copies of prescriptions, etc.
- Extra car and house **keys**
- **Whistle** (to attract attention, if needed)
- **Plastic storage bags** (to keep things dry)
- **Garbage bags** and **duct tape**
- Any other items specific to your household's needs, including pet supplies, baby essentials, comfort items, extra pair of glasses, etc.

These kits should be refreshed twice a year. Check all expiry dates on foods and batteries and replace anything expired. Replace the water with a fresh supply.

Burn at Night, Prevent Fright - Grass Fires

Under **Open Air Fire By-law 17-35**, holders of valid fire permits may not burn brush, drum, and windrow fires between the hours of 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. from April 1 to October 31, 2026. During this time of the year, open air burning is limited to the evening because there is less of a risk for fires becoming out of control. Temperatures traditionally get cooler and humidity rises at night, allowing vegetation to soak up some of that moisture. This moisture is key in making vegetation less volatile fuel for wildfires.

Please check our website or call 613-706-4004 **before burning** to ensure there is no burn ban in place. Permits may be obtained online for FREE at mm.burnpermits.com.

Read the by-law carefully before you burn to ensure that you understand specific restrictions to open air burning.

The Seed Library is a community resource, open to everyone. Visitors are welcome to take the seeds they need at either branch (Pakenham or Almonte), and are encouraged to donate back what they can later in the year

when the plants they grow produce more seeds. By donating seeds back to the Seed Library, you create an infinite supply loop of seeds! These seeds harvested locally will be conditioned to our climate and soil conditions, which result in more resilient future crops.
